





Referencing basics

What is referencing?

When you use the words or ideas of another author in your work using a referencing system allows you to clearly acknowledge their contribution, whether you quote directly or just refer to them. It also ensures that people reading your written work can easily find the author's work for themselves.

Plagiarism

What is a citation?

Citations identify your sources within the text.

e.g. According to Taylor (2013, p.45), five discursive leadership strategies...

What is a reference?


A reference is the full record of your source that will be included in the reference list or bibliography.

e.g. Taylor, S. (2013) *What is discourse analysis?* London: Bloomsbury Academic.

Cite Them Right Online



Cite Them Right Online is a comprehensive referencing resource. It will help you to cite and reference just about any source and to avoid plagiarism. The site also allows you to create your own references by copying the layout of a record; you can then email the example to yourself or cut and paste it into a document.



Visual referencing

Visual sources are regularly used in written assignments at UAL.

This [Visual Referencing Guide](#) explains how the Harvard reference style can apply to such images. Examples include illustrations from journals, websites and social media.

Referencing foreign language material

Reference the exact text used, in the same style as you would reference English language material. For example, for a foreign language book, use the following template:

Family name, INITIAL(S). Year. *Title*. Place of publication: Publisher.

Example:

Foucault, M. 1971. *L'archéologie du savoir*. Paris: NRF/Gallimard.
